

Certified 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor Job Description

General Purpose: Be responsible for the teaching of knowledge and skills related to a specific shooting sports discipline to 4-H members, ages 8-18

Responsibilities:

- Teach the program following the National 4-H curriculum and the National Minimum 4-H Shooting Sports Standards
- Coordinate activities with district/county shooting sports coordinator
- Coach members on proper shooting sports techniques
- Recruit and train assistant instructors as needed
- Inform Coordinator about and help secure needed equipment and facilities
- Recruit parents and members
- Maintain discipline certification to Kansas 4-H Shooting Sports standards
- Help plan the yearly program
- Actively encourage and support members by working with them individually to review project work.
- Encourage members to participate in other 4-H events and activities
- Help publicize 4-H shooting sports activities and results
- Maintain records on activities and project work
- Assist in recruiting, screening and utilizing other volunteers for the club.
- Communicate regularly with the district/county coordinator, parents and members
- Abide by the policies of Kansas State Extension, Department of Kansas 4-H Youth Development and the local Extension Unit.
- Complete the 4-H Volunteer Screening and be enrolled in 4honline

Qualifications:

- Ability to work with youth and adults
- Have an interest in shooting and some knowledge and experience with shooting techniques
- Be familiar with 4-H objectives and philosophy and/or willing to learn about them.
- Age 21 or older for all disciplines (ages 14-20 for apprentice instructors)
 - Apprentice instructors, ages 14-20, must be under the direct supervision of an adult certified in the discipline they are teaching/assisting. The certified adult instructor must be in eyesight of the entire range at all times.
